

HOW TO PURCHASE A LICENSE

1 . Visit the Morden Community Centre

2 . Bring proof of rabies vaccination:

Be sure to bring in your proof of a current rabies vaccination from a licensed veterinarian.

3 . Complete the form: Staff at the Morden Community Centre will help you with this. They will ask you for the animal's name, age, breed, color and markings and if it is male or female.

4 . Pay the License Fee: See the fees in this brochure.

5 . Receive a Tag (place on collar of dog).

You will be given a metal tag that will have the year, Town of Morden and the license number on it. This information will be sent to the Vet Clinic and the By-Law Officer so that they too have this information on file.

Animal Control By-Law



What does it mean to you?

ANIMAL CONTROL

You are permitted to have domesticated animals, such as dogs and cats as pets, with the maximum allowed being two of each. You can help keep your pet safe by following these rules.

- You are responsible for buying a license for your dog. All dogs must be licensed. You can purchase the license at the Morden Community Centre By-Law office.
- All animals are not allowed to run at large or trespass on public or private property. They must be contained on your yard.
- They are not allowed to disturb the peace by barking or howling.
- They must be leashed when walking/exercising.
- Please pick up waste if your animal has defecated on public or private property and dispose of it.

If your dog is **not licensed**, it is brought to the Morden Veterinary Clinic; there is a daily cost for the animal to be impounded at the Vet Clinic, plus a fine, plus a fee for a valid dog license. If your dog is **licensed** and is brought in, you are required to pay all the above fines except the dog license fee. These fees and fines must be paid before the animal is released from the Vet Clinic. All fees are paid at the Morden Community Centre. If you have any questions about licensing your dog, please contact the Town of Morden By-Law Officer 822-5431.

LICENSE & KENNEL FEES

Application Fees

For a kennel permit	\$150.00
For a permit to keep restricted animals	\$150.00

License Fees (Annual) & Related Changes

For each spayed female or neutered male dog	\$10.00
For each male dog	\$30.00
For each female dog	\$30.00
Replacement tag	\$5.00
Transfer of license	\$5.00
Kennel permit – annual fee	\$100.00
Restricted Animal permit – annual fee	\$100.00

A penalty of Five (\$5.00 + GST) Dollars shall be charged on every license issued after the 31st day of March of the year in which said license is due, unless the owner produces a bill of sale dated after the 31st day of March or produces some other evidence establishing his ownership being acquired after the 31st day of March in the license year.

NOTE: Having a dog license can sometimes prevent your pet being taken to the Vet Clinic because we know who to call.

Animal Cages

For each cat trap – deposit	\$50.00
For each animal trap-deposit	\$50.00
For each animal device available	\$50.00

IMPOUNDMENT FINES

Penalties & Impoundment Fines

For any dog, cat or any other domestic pet that was apprehended running at large or was for any other reason impounded.

For first impoundment at the Vet Clinic, flat fine: (No GST)	\$45.00*
For each day of impoundment, at the Vet Clinic: (Plus GST)	\$12.00*
For second impoundment, flat fine (No GST) - <i>if it occurs within 12 months of the first offense.</i>	\$75.00*
For each day of impoundment: (Plus GST)	\$12.00
Impoundment fines for Livestock at the Vet Clinic: (No GST)	\$25.00
Impoundment fines for dangerous animals, quarantined animals and restricted animals:	\$25.00

* Where the dog, cat or any other domestic pet is eventually claimed by a humane society for adoption to someone who was not the owner at the time the animal was apprehended, and provided that the animal is spayed or neutered prior to adoption, this fee shall be waived.

Sample Calculation without Dog License:

1 st Impoundment Fine	\$45.00
4 days impoundment Fine	\$48.00 **
Dog License Fee (Male Dog)	\$30.00
Sub-Total	\$123.00
** GST – 5%	\$2.40
Total	\$125.40
