

141 - 7th Street



Original building was built in 1898 as Van Buren's Livery Stable with a capacity of 40 to 50 horses. Mr Ezre Clubine ran the Livery Stable. Farmers from surrounding districts came to Town and during winter months and especially on hot summer days patronized the livery stable.

When cars became the way of transportation the building was sold to the Rogal Brothers who renovated it into a bowling alley. This ran only a couple of years and then the building was changed into a cleaning business – Morden Dry Cleaning. (1952 to 1980's)

The building has a Boomtown Style front. This style was used a lot to make the building appear bigger.
