A hardware business was established on this site by A. P. Brown in 1895. In 1907, it was taken over by hardware merchants J. H. Conner and A. W. Livingston, with the offices of Winkler and Coppinger, appraisers, on the second floor. Successors in the hardware business were J. H. Conner, 1913; A. W. Livingston, 1923 and after WW II, Donald Livingston joined the firm. The business was known as Marshall Wells in the 60s and later, Livingston's Marshall Wells Furniture and Hardware. In the early 1940s the second floor was unoccupied and was consequently removed. Other businesses in this building included Morden Commercial Printers, Cove's Stationery owned by Stan Cove, Junior Bazaar operated by Lorna and Sonya Unger, and The Gift Gallery owned by Rosemary Haggerty and Linda Smith, later owned by Julia Thiessen. In 2000 Basil Holewka established "Photography by Basil" at this location.
